

- After this course, keeping up with current events is essential to being a global, educated citizen






2 Empathy

• Empathy: the ability to understand the feelings of others; allows a deeper connection and understanding




What issues do you empathize with?


- Change doesn't immediately happen at a larger level

How can you take your career goals and apply them globally?




