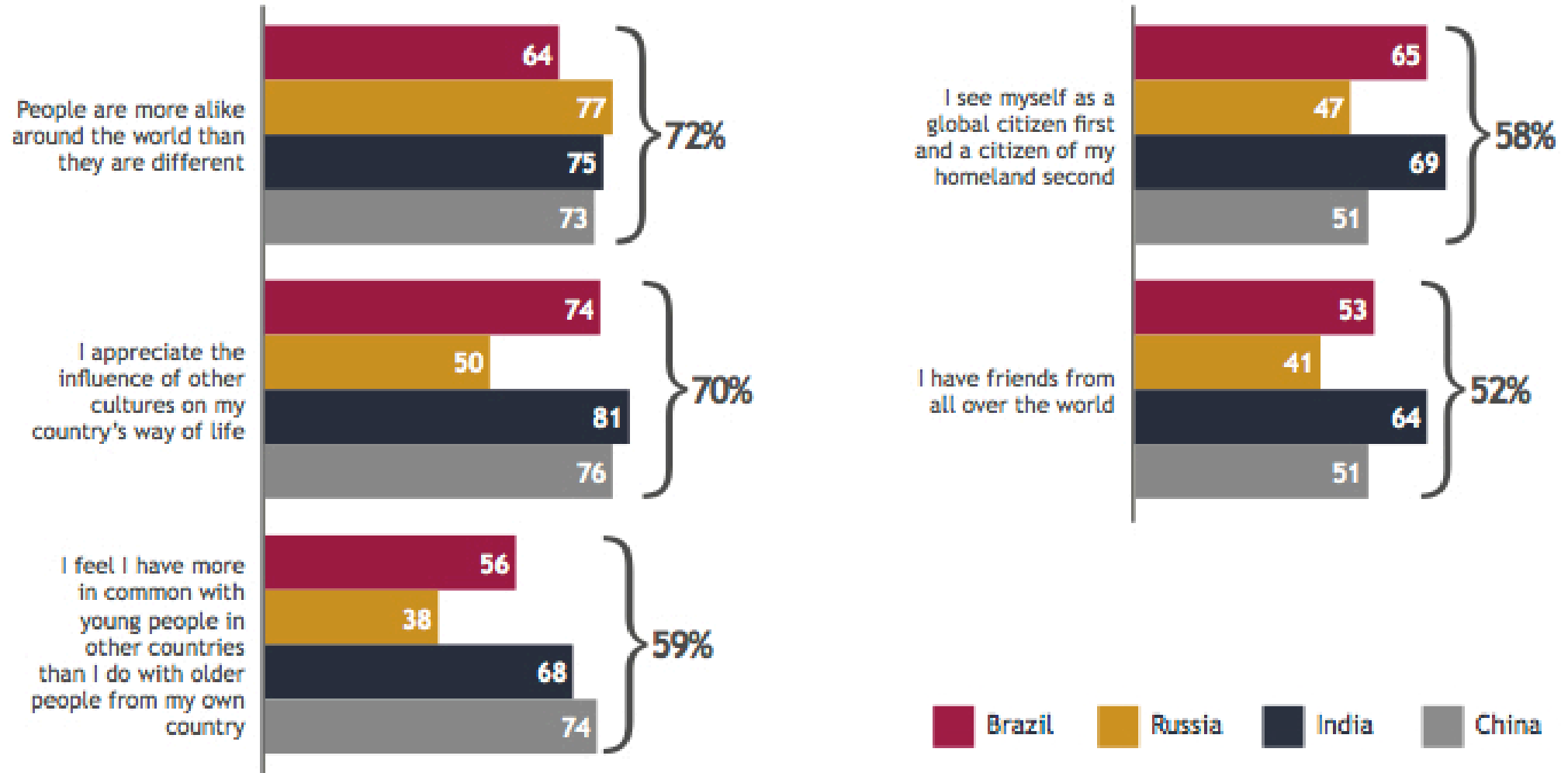

- Empathy: the ability to understand the feelings of others; allows a deeper connection and understanding

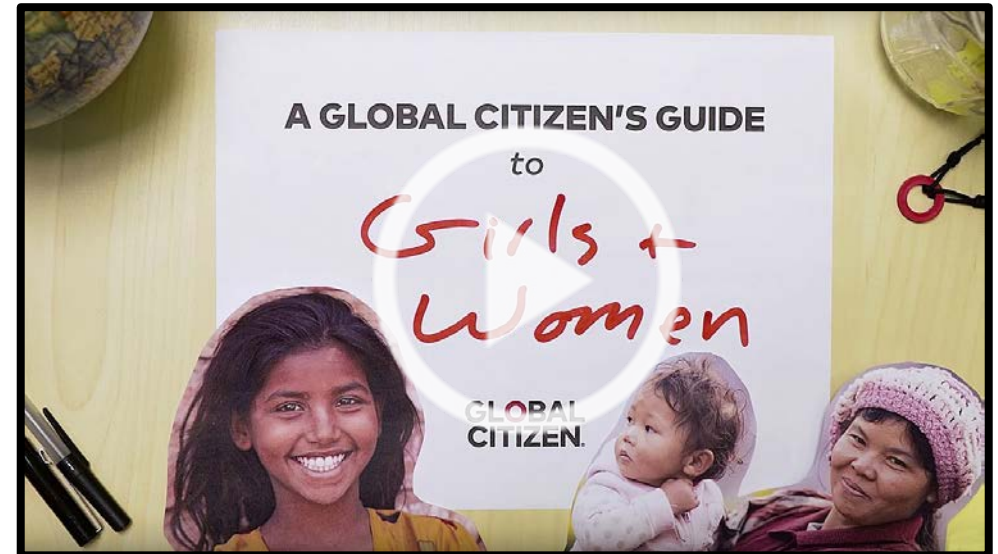


What issues do you empathize with?

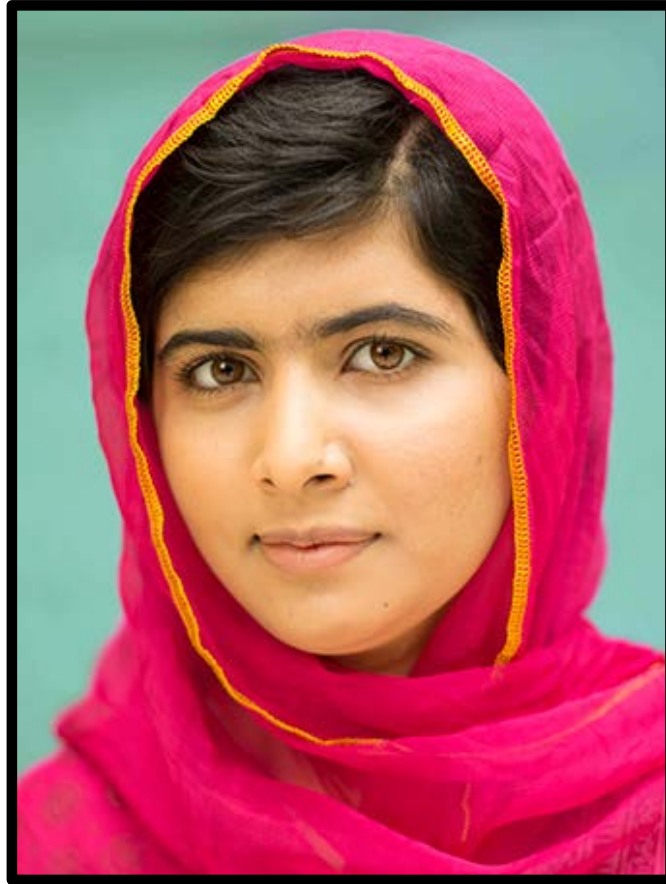
